

SIL's open-source Graphite code can be integrated into any software to deal with complex stacked characters often found in minority languages.

While we in the Western world read and write with the Roman alphabet, more than half of the world's population doesn't use that kind of writing. Their non-Roman scripts look and behave very differently, presenting unique challenges for computers and computer software. The examples below illustrate some of the differences.
